## Access to Rutland Water from Normanton Park Road:

- The Clerk reported that she has received two different user evidence forms from RCC, with which to challenge Anglian Water on the closure of the gate at Normanton Park Road, and to apply for a Definitive Map Modification Order. PH confirmed that he has seen both forms, and that the full user evidence form is complicated.
- It was agreed that BS will circulate both forms to the Parish Council so that a decision can be taken on how best to use the forms.
- GW confirmed that a walking group of which she is a member has also challenged the closure of this access point to Rutland Water.
- Yellow lines have now been put on the road around the the gate, and this has meant that more people are now parking cars on the verge to use the stile further up the road. As a result the bollards are now damaged. It was agreed that BS will contact David Brown at RCC to draw this to his attention.
- KB will also put this on the next Rutland Water Partnership agenda
- AT expressed concern at the danger to children as they run across the road from parked cars into the traffic.

## Reduction in retained firemen at Oakham Fire Station

- In response to a question from NM, GF confirmed that the future of the retained firemen at Oakham Fire Station has been drawn to the attention of the Parish Council
- KB confirmed that all Fire Authorities have had funding reduced to cover a £4m deficit in the Fire Service nationally. A deputation from Leicestershire and Rutland would be going to London on 28 October to put the case for different treatment as the county has the second lowest charge in the country. Either the county receives a dispensation from the reduction in funding, or the precept will have to increase as a one off. The fire station in Uppingham is manned only by a retained crew at a cost of £113k per annum. Oakham Fire Station is manned by a whole time crew and a retained crew. In order to reduce expenditure it is proposed that the retained crew is disbanded, and heavy duty tenders based at the station could be utilised elsewhere. KB confirmed that the Chief Fire Officer will be coming to RCC Scrutiny Committee on 27 November to discuss the proposals. If a representative from the Parish Council wished to attend, they will be welcome (7 pm in the Council Chamber). No final decisions will be taken until February 2015.
- The matter was raised in the Parish Council Forum, the minutes of which will be circulated to all Parish Councils.

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	<ul> <li>It was agreed that depending on the outcome of the deputation to London, the Parish Council will raise their concerns with the Fire Authority, and Member of Parliament.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>NM confirmed that an attempt was made to burgle his house when he was on holiday. He felt the response from the police was tardy, and expressed concern that this is part of a general move by police, ambulance and fire to withdraw services in rural areas to leave them more vulnerable.</li> <li>GW confirmed that the Ambulance Service has been to RCC Scrutiny Committee three times, and they have now been able to produce Rutland specific data on response times. She is now more hopeful that this will provide ammunition to show that their policy of reducing service is detrimental to Rutland's rural area.</li> <li>GF confirmed that it took 45 minutes for an ambulance to arrive in response to a call in the village. AT has waited 6 hours for an ambulance in the past.</li> </ul>	
	<b>Lamp post King Edwards Way/Manton Lane</b> – this appears t be rotting and has been reported to RCC.

Replacement of seats in Edith Weston	<ul> <li>PH reminded the Parish Council that it was proposed earlier in the year to start a rolling programme of replacing the seats in the village, starting with the one outside the village hall.</li> <li>GF confirmed that the Tommy's Close Trustees would be prepared to give their seat to the PC if the PC is willing to replace it with another seat.</li> <li>It was agreed that JB will survey all the seats in the village and report back.</li> </ul>	JB

She has expressed interest, as requested in the letter. GW asked the Parish Council to ensure they are fully aware of the areas for grass cutting in the Parish.</li> <li>GF read out the letter received from the Chair of Tommy's Close Trustees, thanking the Parish Council for the donation to the maintenance of the play area.
