#yousaidwedid - Beat Priorities

This month sees the quarterly update of our beat priorities. Every 3 months we assess our crime figures, local intelligence and results of Neighbourhood Link surveys to give us a picture of what has been happening, and what we need to focus on going forward.

Neighbourhood Link surveys play a **huge** part in our decision making here, it's our main conduit for capturing residents views and allows you to have a say in what we should be doing, and where we should be doing it.

Our 3 priorities for the next quarter are:

Road Safety - Primarily speeding in around our villages, but also dangerous and inconsiderate driving, and a focus on minimising collision risk for cyclists and other non vehicular road users

Anti Social Behaviour - Specific incidents between neighbours, but also wider environmental and noise complaints, and an emerging issue of responsible dog ownership and proper control in public places

Vehicle Crime - Theft of vehicles, theft of tools from tradespersons vehicles, fuel thefts on the A1 corridor, theft utilising RF scanner devices, but also abandoned vehicles having committed trespass on fields.

Some of our work on these topics will be around education and you will see prevention and safety advice across our social media channels, but we will also be looking at speed enforcement in hotspot areas, ANPR monitoring and proactive overt and covert patrols.
