All things Melton

There has been some excellent proactive work in Melton over the last seven days which has led to the arrest of three prolific offenders for a range of crimes which have had a significant impact on our local communities, we will continue to target those causing the most harm to our communities.

Crime of note

This week 32,000 vapes (e-cigarettes) and a large quantity of cigarettes were stolen from a location in the Borough of Melton, these items were counterfeit and could present a significant risk to the health of anyone using the devices. If you are offered any vapes and you are unsure of the legitimacy, please do not use and report to use via the usual contact methods to report. It is getting to that time of year where we will start to focus on our drink/drug driving campaign over the festive period, this in light with road safety being a priority across the policing area. The last seven days has seen some awful weather which has led to some challenging driving conditions and flooded,



none the less local officers have arrested and charged two people in separate incidents, both individuals were subsequently remanded to court. We now have all our neighbourhood officers trained in the use of our SL700 speed gun which gives us an excellent capacity through our road safety operation to target specific locations highlighted as areas where speeding is an issue.
